*HPV = Human Papillomavirus



What is HPV*?

- These are viruses that cause potentially **cancerous** infections.
- They are transmitted through direct skin contact during sexual intercourse, **with or without penetration.**
- **In 10% of cases, HPV* persists and can cause lesions or cancer.**

***HPV = Human Papillomavirus**

HPV* is responsible for:

- **100%** of cervical cancers
- **90%** of anal cancers
- **27%** of penile cancers
- **23%** of vulvar and vaginal cancers
- **35%** of mouths and throat cancers

Why get vaccinated?

Vaccines limit HPV* infections, the spread of HPV* viruses and, above all, **their complications.**

Every year in France, more than **7,000 cancers** are caused by HPV*.

In countries where vaccination coverage exceeds 80%**; cervical cancer is on the decline and other HPV*-related cancers **have fallen sharply.**

Who can get vaccinated?

- Everyone **between the ages of 11 and 14**
- Extended catch-up vaccination available for everyone **up to the age of 26**
- Regardless of gender, sexual orientation, practices, etc.

The HPV* vaccine is effective and safe; it is a means of preventing cancer!
